PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAMME

The primary aim of this short learning programme is to equip professionals with essential knowledge of end-of-life and bereavement counselling/intervention by providing theoretical frameworks associated with the field of loss, grief and bereavement. At the same time, this course aims to develop skills in applying specific end-of-life and bereavement intervention techniques and to give an opportunity for participants to learn from each other. This is an online course scheduled over 20 weeks of assignments which include blogging, critical review of scientific articles, critical review of videos and regular chat room sessions. At the end of the course you will be assessed by means of a portfolio of evidence (PoE) which will include some of the assignments done during the course. The PoE will have a practical component and all assignments to be added to your PoE will be indicated throughout the workshop.

WHO CAN ENROL FOR THIS COURSE?

Any registered health professional, including: Social workers, psychologists, nurses, theologists, medical practitioners and other allied health professionals such as occupational therapists, pharmacists, dieticians and physiotherapists.

- Define the concepts of loss, end of life, death, grief, and bereavement
- Evaluate the palliative care ethics and values associated with end of life and bereavement counselling
- Analyse the role and context of end of life and bereavement counselling amongst different cultural groups in South Africa
- Compare the theories and models of bereavement and the application thereof in the South African environment
- Identify cultural and spiritual rituals in end of life and bereavement
- Demonstrate age appropriate end of life and bereavement intervention (Adults, adolescents and children as clients)
- Differentiate between normal grief and complicated grief
- Assess the needs of the dying person and his significant others
- Assess the needs of the bereaved person and his significant others
- Implement the components of end of life and bereavement counselling
- Align client needs to specific intervention options
