Do you work in the field of children, youth or families and communities? Do you have a keen interest in obtaining answers and finding solutions that will resolve issues in a complex society, such as children's rights and the voice of the child, child protection issues, family life, youth at risk, sexual abuse, child-parent relationships, relational well-being, trauma, only to name a few? Do you seek a course that can provide you with hands-on knowledge and career growth opportunities? Then a Masters in Social Work (MSW-Research) is the degree for you.



Masters Degree in Social Work (MSW) G801P/M/V (8CS N01)

Purpose of this programme:

- This degree gives you the opportunity to conduct research in several focus areas as outlined in this document. On completion of the degree you will be able to demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of the research process and prove your ability to do independent research.
- You will also be considered as a master in your specific field of research on the completion of the degree. It takes two years to complete the degree. You will be supported by a highly skilled study supervisor and receive group supervision more or less twice a year. There will be no formal classes or modules.

Admission requirements:

- A four year Bachelor's degree in Social Work.
- Students enrolling for this programme must provide proof of registration as a social worker as required by the Act on Social Service Professions 1978 (Act 110 of 1978).
- Candidates must have achieved an average of at least 60% in the BSW degree.

The selection procedure:

- Online application is submitted.
- An initial paper-based selection is done.
- Submission of a mini proposal.
- Each applicant will be subjected to a selection interview by a post graduate panel of Compres.
- Applicants need to have an idea of the fields of study as indicated in this document and in which project they want to complete their research.

Closing date for applications:

30 September of year prior to study commencement.

 - A certified copy of your identity document.
 - A certified copy of your complete academic record that includes your final results of qualification
 - A certified copy of your registration at SACSSP.
 - A mini proposal of your intended study.
- Candidates who pass the first round of "paper selection" will be provided with detailed information regarding the rest of the process. This includes a selection interview.
